Proceedings of the 3<sup>rd</sup> H.P State Biodiversity Board (HPSBB) meeting held on 21.11.2018 under the Chairmanship of Chairman HPSBB-cum-Chief Secretary Govt. of H.P in the Ellerselie Building, Committee room, H.P. Secretariat, Shimla.

3<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the H.P. State Biodiversity Board was organised on 21.11.2018 under the Chairmanship of Sh. B.K. Aggarwal, IAS. Chairman HPSBB -cum- Chief Secretary Govt. of H.P in the Ellerselie building, Committee room, H.P Secretariat, Shimla. Chief Secretary had authorised Sh. R.D. Dhiman IAS. Additional Chief Secretary Env. Sci & Tech. cum Chairman HIMCOSTE, Shimla to Chair the meeting:

At the outset of the meeting, all the dignitaries were welcomed by Sh. Kunal Satyarthi, IFS, Member Secretary, H.P. State Biodiversity Board (HPSBB) and HIMCOSTE. He appraised and informed the house that the Biological Diversity Act 2002 and Rules 2004 are being implemented in the State in order to fulfil the commitments under Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) and aspirations of the Nagoya Protocol of 2010.

He further elaborated that the HPSBB was constituted in the year 2005 in the State for the implementation of Biological Diversity Act(BDA), 2002 and Biological Diversity Rules(BDR), 2004. The Board is now established and functioning from the New HIMCOSTE Building "Vigyan Bhawan" at Bemloe, Shimla, Himachal Pradesh.

Thereafter, a detailed presentation was made by the Member Secretary, HPSBB, in which he appraised the house about the major activities undertaken by the Board for the implementation and fulfilment of the provisions of the Biological Diversity Act. 2002 & Biodiversity Rules 2004. The house was also appraised about the structure of the **Biodiversity Management** 



Committees (BMCs) as per the provisions enshrined in the Biological Diversity Act, 2002 and Biodiversity Rules 2004 and also the procedures adopted for the constitution of BMCs. The Member Secretary informed the Board members that HPSBB has constituted 609- BMCs till now and amounts in instalments upto a maximum of Rs. 60,000/-each have/are being released by the HPSBB. Tripartite Memorandum of Understanding (MoUs) have been signed with 121-Gram Panchayats and the Technical Support Group (TSG) for the preparation of People's Biodiversity Register (PBR) in the Gram Panchayats/MC and grants to these 121 Panchayats have also been released by the HPSBB. These PBRs are being prepared under the supervision and guidance of the TSG's namely; Himachal Pradesh University (HPU), Summer Hill, Shimla; Himalayan Forest Research Institute (HFRI), Panthaghati, Shimla; Dr. YS Parmar, University of Horticulture & Forestry, Nauni, Solan; Chowdhry, Sarvan Kumar Krishi Vishv Vidyalay Palampur, Kangra and Govind Ballabh Pant National Institute of Himalayan Environment and Sustainable Development, Mohal, Distt. Kullu.

The members and representatives of these institutes shared their thoughts, experiences and methods adopted by them for the execution of the work in the field in detail. Six PBRs of BMCs Narwana Khas (Kangra), Jana and Tandi (Kullu), Batal (Solan), and Sainj and Shakrori (Shimla) were shared with the members and the Chairman HPSBB appreciated the efforts. It was also opined that the details should be put in public domain so that it could be assessed and used by other researchers and people having interest in the field.

Thereafter, the agenda items were placed for discussion before the house by Sh. Kunal Satyarthi, IFS, Member Secretary, H.P. State Biodiversity Board, which are as under:

- The three district level workshops organized in Sirmour, Chamba and Kullu in the current financial year with financial support of NBA, Chennai and UNEP-GEF Project for Panchayat Pradhan's and other PRI's and Stakeholder Departments in association with the H.P. State Forest Department was appreciated and approved.
- Board decided that efforts should be made on creation of more BMCs at Panchayat level in the current financial year in these four districts. The BMCs at ZillaParishad, Block Samiti and Notified Area Committees level should not be the priority and could be taken up later.
- Board approved the proposal for release of funds as per the guidelines and norms for effective functioning of the BMCs. Mechanisms of reporting w.r.t. Local Biodiversity Fund (LBF) and better monitoring should also be put in place.
- Grant released to BMCs till date in the current financial year was approved.

8. Preparation of People's Biodiversity Register (PBR)

- Progress till 31.03.2016 was placed and approved. Concern was shown over the slow pace in documentation of PBR; in the past ten years.
- It was decided that the HPSBB would seek proposals for the preparation of People's Biodiversity Register (PBR) at Gram Panchayat Level from local universities (both Government and Private) and R&D institutions located in the State as per the terms of reference set by the Member Secretary of HPSBB and norms & guidelines for PBR, prepared by the NBA Chennai.
- It was also decided that in event of no positive outcome being received from the universities & Institutions as

• The Board has collaborated with various R&D Institutes and Universities of the State namely Dr. Y.S. Parmar University of Horticulture and Forestry, Nauni, Solan; GB Pant National Institute of Himalayan Environment and Sustainable Development Kullu; CSK Himachal Pradesh Krishi Vishvavidyalaya, Palampur; Himalayan Forest Research Institute, Shimla; and Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla and assigned as Technical Support Group (TSG) for the preparation of People's Biodiversity Register in the State.

### 9. Operationalization of Biodiversity Management Committees (BMCs)

- It was decided by the Board to follow the BDA, 2002 and the BD Rules, 2004 for the formation of the BMCs at Panchayat level. Accordingly, the BMC shall consists of a Chairperson and not more than six persons nominated by the local body, of whom not less than one third should be women and not less than 18% should to the Scheduled belong Castes/Scheduled Tribes. Chairperson of the BMC shall be elected form amongst the members of the Committee in a meeting to be chaired by the Chairperson of the local body.
  - However, it was also decided that for effective functioning of the BMC, an advisory would be issued to all the panchayats of the four prioritized districts to nominate the Panchayat Pradhan (Chairperson of the local body) or the Up-pradhan to function as the Chairperson of the BMC with co-terminus tenures.
  - The advisory should also mention that the BMC could co-opt two official members out of the Stakeholder Departments namely; Agriculture, Horticulture, Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Animal Husbandry, Ayurveda, as the case may be.
  - It was also decided that keeping in view the large extent of forest cover in the State and large scale biodiversity being present in the forests, the forest Guard of the Forest Department would be the Secretary of the BMC at Panchayat level within his

jurisdiction. The Forest Range Officer or Block Officer would be the Secretary of BMCs at Block Samiti, Zilla Parishad and NAC level local body and Divisional Forest Officer concerned would act as Nodal Officer.

 Matter would be referred to AD for issuance of appropriate notification in this regards.

#### 10. State Level Data bank on Diverse Biological Resources

The agenda was approved, as proposed. It was emphasized by the members that State Level database on diverse biological resources is very important for bringing in all the scattered information about biological resources of the State at one place. **HPSBB** would write to all universities. Institutions, organizations, eminent scientists and line departments for obtaining and compiling of State Level Data Band on diverse biological resources.

#### 11. Access and Benefit Sharing (ABS) of bio-resources for commercial utilization or bio-survey and bioutilization for commercial utilization

- It was decided that as proposed, a HPSBB – Industries Dialogue Meet would be organised by the Board in the month of November/December, 2016 for dissemination of information about the provisions of BDA, 2002 & BDA Rules, 2004.
- Thereafter, the process of issuing notices to companies/industries accessing biological resources of the State for commercial utilization or the bio-survey and bio-utilization leading to commercial utilization using the biological resources would be initiated for benefits sharing as per BDA, 2002, BD Rules, 2004 and the ABS Guidelines, 2014 of the Govt. of India.

Divisional Forest Officers of HP Forest Department as Nodal Officer for the implementation of Biological Diversity Act, 2002 and Rules, 2004 in the Forest Divisions as per GoHP notification no. FFE-A(B) 19-2/2017 dated 25.07.2017.

- The Board would organize an Industrial Dialogue meet for dissemination of information about provisions of Biological Diversity Act, 2002 and Rules, 2004 and the ABS Guidelines, 2014.
- Thereafter, the process of issuing notices to companies/industries accessing biological resources of the State for commercial utilization or the bio-survey and bio-utilization leading to commercial utilization using the biological resources without prior intimation would be initiated for access regulation and for benefits sharing as per BDA, 2002, BD Rules, 2004 and the ABS Guidelines, 2014 of the Govt. of India.

### LBF Proposed from NBA Grant (2018-19):

- a) An amount of Rs. 84,40,000/- (Rs. Eighty Four Lakh and Forty Thousand) has been sanctioned by NBA Chennai, GoI vide letter F.No. 15/08/BMC/2012/4081 dated 13.03.2018 (Annexure-IX). It is proposed to release LBF to 230 BMCs constituted for the financial year 2018-19.
- b) It is proposed to release an amount of Rs. 21,50,000/- as LBF to 45 BMCs during the FY 2018-19.

In addition, keeping in view the important role of BMCs in conservation of biological resources, an advisory should be issued through R&D Department to the local bodies/BMCs to form a local TSG by involving frontline staff of Stakeholder Departments namely Forest, Agriculture, Horticulture, Ayurveda, Animal Husbandry, Fisheries, Knowledgeable persons and Local NGO/Societies in the BMC's.

### The agenda was approved, as proposed.

After detailed discussion it was decided that:

- In the four biodiversity rich districts namely: Chamba, Kullu, Shimla and Sirmour, BMCs would be constituted at the Panchayat level.
- In the four districts of Solan, Bilaspur, Una and Hamirpur where there is not much variation in the biological diversity, BMC and PBR will be constituted at district level.
- In Mandi district, BMC will be constituted at Panchayat level in all the blocks except for Sadar and Balh where Block level BMC's will be constituted. In Kangra district, panchayat level BMC's will be constituted only in Baijnath and Panchrukhi block and in other areas BMC's will be constituted at the block level.
- In Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti districts, BMCs will be formed preferably at Panchayat level
  with the help of UNDP project and also with the help of Tribal Development Department.
  However, if adequate funds are not made available BMCs would be constituted at the Block
  level. (District wise Map-Annexure-IV).
- An Advisory be issued through the Director, Panchayati Raj and Rural Development to the local bodies, so that the formation of BMCs could be accelerated.

### ITEM NO. 3.3: Preparation of People's Biodiversity Register (PBR)

The Board approved the involvement of Universities/Institutions of the State in the preparation of 121-PBRs as Technical Support Group (TSG), on the basis of Tripartite agreements and also approved the involvement of more Universities/Institutions, both Government and Private, in the preparation of PBR's. The board granted approval for the release of following funds received from (a) NBA Grant and (b) UNEP-GEF Grant in FY 2018-19 for the preparation of PBRs:

### a) Funds received from NBA Grant in FY 2018-19:

In the FY 2018-19, HPSBB has received an amount of Rs. 51,75,000/- (Rs Fifty One Lakhs and Seventy Five Thousand only) from NBA, Chennai, GoI, vide sanction letter no. NBA/16/08/PBR/2012/1095 dated 26.06.2018 for the preparation of 45-People's Biodiversity Registers (PBR).

### b) Funds received from UNEP-GEF Grant in FY 2018-2019:

An amount of Rs. 23,00,000/- has been sanctioned by UNEP-GEF for the preparation of 20 Gram Panchayat level PBRs and Rs. 9,20,000/- has been sanctioned under UNEP-GEF grant for the preparation of 4- district level PBRs. A total of Rs. 32,20,000/- is to be released.

The agenda was approved, as proposed.

ITEM NO. 3.4: Access and Benefit Sharing (ABS) of bio-resources for commercial utilization.

**A:** Dabur India Ltd, 8/3, Asaf Ali Road, New Delhi-110002 has submitted an application on Form-I, for commercial utilization of 21 biological resources for the preparation of Ayurvedic medicines which has been utilized during the financial years 2014-15 & 2015-16. ABS fee would be levied accordingly on Dabur India Ltd and they would be asked to pay an amount of **Rs. 34,34,271/-**(Rupees Thirty four lakhs thirty four thousand two hundred and seventy two only) for FY 2014-15 and **Rs. 36,85,519/-** (Rupees Thirty six lakhs eighty five thousand five hundred and nineteen only) for FY 2015-16. This amount will be paid in a single instalment within one month of signing of the agreement.

#### The agenda was approved, as proposed.

**B:** The currently available list of 706 Industries/Companies which are accessing biological resources from the State for commercial utilization will be invited in the Industrial Dialogue and thereafter will be asked to share access & benefits as per the BDA, 2002 and Rules 2004 and ABS Guidelines.

# ITEM NO. 3.5: Declaration and documentation of Biodiversity Hot Spots i.e. areas of biodiversity importance in the State as Biodiversity Heritage Sites (BHS)

The WWF India has been assigned the work of compilation of data regarding the Sacred Groves in the State. Draft report of district Shimla and Kullu was tabled during the meeting. An amount of Rs. 7,00,000/- is now approved by the board to be released as second year instalment to WWF India for the identification and data gathering of remaining ten-districts of the State and submit final report to the Board. Thereafter, Board would identify the best Sacred Groves, depending on extent of Biological diversity and importance which could be declared as Biodiversity Heritage Site under Section 37 of BDA-2002 and BHS guidelines.

The agenda was approved, as proposed.

### ITEM NO. 3.6: Dissemination of the information through resource material

Board approved the previous publication of documents/ books and the expenditure thereof. HPSBB has compiled following documents and these would be printed under UNEP-GEF grant/NBA/Grant/ State Budget in FY 2018-19.

- a) Status of biodiversity in Himachal Pradesh
- b) Traditional Foodgrain Crops and other lesser known Edible Plants of Himachal Pradesh
- c) Underexplored Wild Edible Fruits of Himachal Pradesh
- d) Tradable Bio-resources in Himachal Pradesh: Potential and Scope
- e) Traditional food grain crops of Himachal Pradesh
- f) Fish diversity in Himachal Pradesh
- g) Butterflies of subalpine and alpine areas of Himachal Pradesh
- h) Wild edible fruits of Himachal Pradesh
- i) Commercially important ABS potential medicinal plants of Himachal Pradesh

It was proposed that the Board may approve printing of 300 more copies of above said books for distribution to the various line departments and stakeholders through open tendering. The cost of printing will be met out of the UNEP-GEF-MoEFCC ABS project.

### Item No. 3.10: Separate State Budget Head for HPSBB

The matter would be taken up with AD for required action.

## ITEM NO. 3.11: Hiring of Para-Taxonomists at District Level in Himachal Pradesh

The Board took the cognizance of Rs. 30,05,000/- currently available from the amount appropriated for PBRs. Accordingly as proposed, the Board approved hiring of one Para-Taxonomist each for eight Districts i.e., Shimla, Sirmour, Chamba, Kullu, Kinnaur, Lahaul & Spiti, Mandi and Kangra, for helping people at the grass root level for the constitution of BMCs and preparation of PBRs. These Para-taxonomists would be hired on out-sourced basis, out of retired eminent persons from the Department like Forest, Agriculture, Horticulture, and also from amongst the students who are undergoing training on Govt. of India's Green Skill Development Programme (GDSD) at HIMCOSTE, Shimla, Himachal Pradesh. They would be paid fixed remuneration of Rs. 16,000/- per month. They would be initially hired for one year.

The agenda was approved, as proposed.

6 PBRs made under UNEP- GEF in the BMC Sainj and Shakrori of Shimla district, Jana and Tandi of District Kullu, Batal of Solan and Narwana Khas of District Kangra were approved by the Expert Group in the meeting held on 27.2.2017, at Hotel Holiday Home, Shimla. This was also approved by the Board. A copy of PBRs to be provided to the BMC and local body concerned.

The 6-PBRs were approved, as proposed.

## ITEM NO. 3.14: Studies awarded on important aspects of medicinal plants under UNEP GEF-MoEFCC ABS project.

The Studies awarded till now under UNEP-GEF was approved by the Board. One additional study may be undertaken on the trading of Morchella (Guchhi) and Dhoop and it must be brought under ABS, this possibility must be studied and evaluated.
